**National Umpire School:** all should have received the attached information on a National Umpire School being held over near Ocean City, MD in February. This is a VERY worthwhile 2 days session with instructors from the national umpire staff on a 25:1 student ratio. Although the pre-registration has past, I have been told by the organizer the late fee will be waived until January 1st, 2021. The instructors are:

His replacement was named about 3 weeks ago, he is familiar to many of us that have worked the girls fast pitch program. We are told the structure for staffing fast pitch tournaments won't change in the near future as Joe and Steve will work closely to get all tournaments fully staffed.

**HS Season:** as stated previously, still scheduled to start in April. First practice can begin on April 12th and first games on April 26th. Registration is open on the VHSL Whistle site now and can be completed anytime between now and the middle of March. Dates for the clinic and test have not been announced as of yet.

**USA Tournaments:** I think there are currently nearly 30 girls fast pitch tournaments scheduled in Virginia next year. There are a few as early as March and April, we will try to work with Steve and Joe so that our association can work them to the greatest extent possible as a precursor to the start of the HS season.
